Coping with Overwhelming Distress

(Part 2 of 3)

Strategy #2: Be constructive. Focus on what you can do (not on what you can't).

In my previous blog post, I talked about the importance of self-compassion as a key strategy in coping with overwhelming distress in our lives. In this post, I offer a second strategy, which I've observed among those who are successfully managing the stresses of living in war zones and refugee camps. This strategy

has also been very helpful to me personally when I feel overwhelmed by the magnitude of horrors and need in my own country and around the world.

Sometimes, the staggering needs of others feels crushing to me. I see the horrible things happening all over the world. I certainly want to help, but I don't know where to start or how I could possibly make a lasting difference. It seems that whatever I do will only be a drop in the bucket in an ocean full of suffering and need. I start to feel overwhelmed, and my emotional distress gets bigger and bigger.

But Jesus showed us by his example that we don't have to respond this way.

- FHLGM staff in the Congo will continue to distribute financial aid and free copies of Tim's book, What Can We Expect from God Now? to pastors who have been severely affected by the takeover of Goma and Bukavu by M23 rebels.
